

FOI 2025-989

I write in connection with your request dated 17<sup>th</sup> October 2025 concerning NIPs issued at a specific location.

I am required by the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to handle all requests in a manner that is blind as to the identity and motives of the requestor. Any information released as a response to a request is regarded as being published and therefore in the public domain without caveat.

Following receipt of your request, research was conducted by the Office of Police Crime and Commissioner.

Your request for information has now been considered, and I am able to respond as follows.

**You wrote:**

I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to request the following information:

The number of Notice of Intended Prosecution letters issued as a result of the use of vehicle speed measuring equipment at A338, DOWNTON ROAD, NEAR CARAVANS LIMITED, SALISBURY, WILTSHIRE.

Please provide the number of Notice of Intended Prosecution letters issued for each of the last 24 weeks for which data is available.

**Response**

Our Justice Traffic Team have confirmed that over the last 24 weeks the following speeding enforcement has occurred at the location in question: -

These numbers are of course dependent on previous history and convictions. It can take up to 6 months for the final outcomes to be realised, taking into account appeals and so forth.

There may be other offences recorded in our systems as a result of Police Officer enforcement at this location, but these will not have resulted in NOIP's being issued – which is what you are asking for here.

To locate and identify other offences at this location as a result of Police Officer enforcement would entail manually reviewing hundreds of TOR's (Traffic Offence Reports) manually to identify those in question – this would inevitably exempt a response to you under Section 12 (time/cost) – as the cost of doing this would be far in excess of our obligations under The FOIA.

Under our Section 16 obligation to be as helpful as possible to an applicant I would advise the following: -

- Wiltshire Police do not have any active fixed speed cameras in the County.
- Speeding tickets are currently only issued by Officers with hand-held devices at the roadside or from mobile camera vans.
- The camera situation at the traffic lights at the turning for the park and ride / caravan location is not a speed camera – it is likely to be a traffic management camera run by the Highway Agency, not Wiltshire Police.
