I write in connection with your request for information dated 18 January 2019 concerning disabled people taking part in protests.

I am required by the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to handle all requests in a manner that is blind as to the identity and motives of the requester. Any information released as a response to a request is regarded as being published and therefore in the public domain without caveat.

Following receipt of your request, searches were conducted within the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC). I can confirm that the information you have requested is not held by the Police and Crime Commissioner.

You wrote:

Disabled People taking part in Protests

Under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act could you please:

- a. Provide a copy of any policy, instructions, advice or standing orders relating to the supply of information to the Department of Work and Pensions relating to disabled people taking part in protests;
- b. In the event that you have referred any such information to the Department of Work and Pensions, state how many individuals this related to, and over what period of time you have been collecting such information; and
- c. In the event that you rely upon any exemptions in relation to (a) or (b) state whether such documentation exists.

Response

Searches of the OPCC show that no such information is held. I have made enquiries with Wiltshire Police and understand that this information may be held by them. I have, therefore, transferred your request to the Force Disclosure Unit.
